






Little Beaver

Materials: brown yarn, tiny twigs, grass, moss, twine, raffia, crayons, scissors, glue, a book about beavers, stapler

Directions

1. Read a book about beavers then reiterate facts about a beaver's lodge.


BEAVER LODGE FACTS




A beaver's home is called a lodge. Lodges are little dome-shaped houses made from sticks, grass, and moss that is stuck together using mud. They can be up to 8 feet wide. Under the dome roof is a floor that is just slightly above the water level. Many lodges have an underwater door for instant swimming access.

- 2. Label the roof, door and floor on the Beaver Lodge worksheet. My son who is 5 needed me to write the words in the rectangles then he traced over them with an orange crayon.
- 3. Color the roof and floor brown. Color the water blue.
- 4. Glue yarn, twigs, grass, raffia and moss to the roof and floor of the beaver lodge.
- 5. Color and cut out the beaver family then glue into their home.
- 6. Cut out the minibook pages, fold in half then staple to make a book.
- 7. Write out some facts about beavers or draw pictures on the inside pages. My 5-year-old practiced writing the letters from the word "beaver" on the inside pages.
- 8. Glue the book onto the beaver lodge worksheet in the top right corner.

















Beaver Minibook Front Cover






Inside Page

Beaver Craft

Materials: white paper plate, brown tempera paint, glue, scissors, black and brown construction paper, photocopy of the face parts below, large googly eyes, markers or crayons

Directions: On the back of the paper plate write out "Oregon's State animal is the beaver". Paint the top side of the plate with brown paint. Cut out the teeth and set aside. Trace and cut the nose and mouth on black construction paper. Trace and cut the ears and muzzle on brown construction paper. Glue the face parts together. Add brown whiskers with a crayon.






